Help make a difference!

November is Boone Electric Community Trust month at the co-op. The Trust provides funding to nonprofits, public entities (schools, fire/law enforcements, libraries, etc.) and benevolent groups. You, as a member of the cooperative, can assist the Trust in making a difference in all of the communities we serve.

It's as simple as rounding up your utility bill to the next highest dollar through Operation Round Up. For example, your utility bill is \$87.41, you would round up to pay \$88, with the extra 59 cents going to the Trust. Imagine the good that would happen if all members rounded up over the course of their membership!

One organization that is able to help realize its dream through the Trust is Do Something Right Now. They opened their food pantry, located at 313 Hogan Drive in Columbia, in January 2021. Volunteers were immediately put to work packing food for 150 families. The home also acts as a resource to connect residents with needed assistance.

"Opening a food pantry that would serve those in need was a dream of our organization from the beginning," Ex-

supported our application for funding. We are in the
process of rehabilitating a house
on Hogan Drive in
northeast Colum-

bia that had sat vacant for a long time. Between removing the water-damaged sheetrock, flooring and making sure we could fix the areas where leaks were occurring, we just had a hard time finding the funding for everything. It was crucial that the old windows be replaced to avoid more interior water damage. We submitted an application to the Trust for the replacement of windows and were delighted to receive full funding."

"The members of our Trust board do not take their duties lightly," Trust Chairperson Craig Stevenson states. "Each member comes from a diverse background and perspective, which enriches our decision-making. Our decisions are always well-thought through as to what brings value and is beneficial to our communities while maintaining a financial balance for the continuity of the Trust."

The vision of Do Something Right Now is to create a computer room and a tutoring center.

"Not everyone has access to a computer and internet or knows where to find resources to help them," says Riley. "We want to help bridge that gap, but in order to do that we need to get our house turned into a functional space. We have been very blessed with the partners we have found, many who have donated materials and construction knowledge. We know we will make a difference."

Other organizations that have received recent Trust grants include Welcome Home, Harrisburg Lions Club and United Community Builders.
